#### Birds (In left-right up-down order according to Page 1):

- 1. Native to New Zealand. Related to cranes and other rails.
- 2. Stores its primary food source in holes in trees.
- 3. Endangered seabird named after its discoverer on Assumption Island.
- 4. Features black, orange-brown and white plumage, and native to much of Eurasia
- 5. Native to Southeast Asia, and popular as pets in Thailand and Philippines
- 6. Coloured red, green and blue, this bird native to North America is a member of the Cardinal family.
- 7. Carnivorous bird that uses its beak like tongs. Native to Australasia.
- 8. Passerine bird that sometimes catches insects in midair. Native to the Great Basin
- 9. Can be seen in the seas of the Southern Hemisphere, with an estimated population of tens of millions.
- 10. Native to North and Central America. Named after its distinctive wingspots.
- 11. Parrot native to Australia. Their beaks turn from black to orange as they mature.
